

LATEST NEWS FROM BOUGOUDANG



Sr. Dorota Zych sends us this letter on June 4, 2020 :

« A big thank you for thinking of us! I am glad that the coronavirus problem in Europe is more stable. In Chad we have cases, especially in N'Djamena, but they are also in other parts of the country.

Since March, schools have been closed, shops, At the moment some cities are also "closed", so you cannot travel to them. So as we could not advance in our approach for our primary school in Bougoudang. Each week, I stay several days in the village, at the agricultural college, because it is a farm school, so there are things to see and maintain.

For the primary school project, we received 21,000€ from France.

I spoke with the Parents Association and asked for the quote, because we want to start with the construction of 2 classrooms for CP1 and a small teachers' room. Two rooms for the smallest students are needed as they study under a straw

shed and the teachers meet under a tree.

We will try to look for materials, such as gravel, sand, baked bricks ... before the rainy season which is already taking place, so that we can build our building as soon as possible.

Our reality is really "unique" and we can not help but accept the situation of the country.

During the rainy season cars do not pass through our village and I go there by motorbike. Because of this, our work must wait until October or even November. Along with me, I know people like to see quick results of their donations, but in this I learn patience which is not always my strong point!

I hope that our friends at AMASC will understand us and I promise that your help will be well used!
